<p><b>BC Arts Council</b></p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• 31 March update</li> <li>• Arts and culture groups in the Tri-Cities can now apply for a government "resilience supplement" to help pay the bills during the COVID-19 crisis.</li> <li>• Lisa Beare, B.C.'s minister of tourism, arts and culture, announced Supplements of up to \$15,000 will be available through a new \$3-million Arts and Culture Resilience Supplement fund.</li> <li>• Administered by the BC Arts Council, the money is targeted for operating and eligible project clients and provides a 50% advance on 2020-'21 funding.</li> <li>• Spring and Fall Operating Assistance clients will be receiving 50% of their last year's operating grant as an advance for the next intake cycle.</li> <li>• Arts and Culture Resilience Supplement: Operating Assistance clients and eligible project clients will receive a one-time supplement in early April in order to further support organizations during this unprecedented time. Organizations can choose how they spend the funding, guided by the principles of organizational sustainability and supporting the artists and arts and cultural workers you rely on.</li> <li>• This one-time grant will range (maximum \$15,000) depending on the size of your organization.</li> <li>• As well, the council will ease its requirements to help groups with their cash-flow crunches: Deadlines will be pushed for applications, reporting rules will be relaxed and organizations can use government grants to cover immediate operating needs.</li> <li>• The government says workers in the arts sector who have lost income because of COVID-19 are eligible to apply for a one-time payment of \$1,000 under the <a href="#">BC Emergency Benefit for Workers</a>. - In Singapore, the Parliamentary Secretary for Culture, Community and Youth has announced that [the government will allocate S\\$1.6 million for the arts and culture sector](#) to respond to the COVID-19 outbreak. The National Arts Council of Singapore has also announced [two initiatives to support the arts community during COVID-19](#), including one-off funding for a Capability Development Scheme for the Arts (CDSA) to encourage upskilling and grow organisational capabilities; as well as a subsidy for venue hire at national cultural institutions for arts and culture activities.
- While in Hong Kong, the arts community is [collaborating to launch a community-led online platform](#) that will offer online viewing rooms for galleries, as well recorded and live-streamed exhibition walkthroughs.
- Meanwhile in the USA, the [Smithsonian has published an article](#) related to its current exhibition [Outbreak: Epidemics in a Connected World](#) that highlights the powerful role of museums to combat misinformation and make available information that demystifies the emergence and spread of new diseases.

## Arts Council England

Updated 24 March 2020

- **National Portfolio organizations:** £90 million available to NPOs. We hope organisations will use this funding to reboot their creative work, but we also understand it may be required to alleviate financial pressures on NPOs.
- **Orgs outside National Portfolio:** £50 million will be made available to organisations that are not in receipt of regular funding from the Arts Council. Organisations who have applied to National Lottery Project Grants are welcome to apply for this support.
- **Individuals:** artists, creative practitioners and freelancers - £20 million

Updated 15 March 2020

- Business as usual
- no government ordered bans on live events, sporting or music events, public meetings or any other gatherings

Here are our first steps to help people working as artists, freelancers and in publicly funded cultural organisations:

- We will refocus some grant programmes to help compensate individual artists and freelancers for lost earnings. This will require further planning. It may take about 10 days before we can announce the details.
- National Portfolio Organisations (NPOs) and Creative People and Places (CPPs) will continue to receive funding but funding conditions will not apply for at least three months with immediate effect. We can also advance grant payments to assist with cashflow.
- For NPOs and CPPs, the priority is staying in business. In exchange for our support we ask them to honour contracts agreed with freelancers and artists and to think about what help they can offer their communities.

## Creative New Zealand

Updated 24 March

- The initial \$16 million investment, with funding opening 14 April, will be distributed to the sector through to 30 June 2020 (end of Creative New Zealand's financial year). It includes \$4.5 million of new money announced on Friday plus \$11.5 million repurposed from other programmes. Phase two, which will provide support beyond June 2020, will be explored at the April Arts Council meeting.

Creative New Zealand's Emergency Response Package will initially have two components:

- Creative New Zealand is planning quick application turnarounds and rolling weekly decisions for both the Arts Continuity Grant and Emergency Relief Grant, but will monitor this commitment and the rapidly changing environment.
- **Resilience Grants** for eligible artists, arts practitioners, arts groups and arts organisations (non-investment clients) who we know are suffering, to help them recover, maintain and develop their practice in a completely changed environment. There are two opportunities:
  - **Arts Continuity Grant** (up to \$50k), supporting the creation of new work or the reframing of an existing project in light of COVID-19, including creative and professional development, promotion and distribution (eg, supporting new ways of working).
  - **Emergency Relief Grant** (up to \$10k per individual), for eligible artists and arts practitioners, collectives and groups who we know may be experiencing devastating loss of income and opportunity and an uncertain future, and who have applied for the announced government support. More details to come - applications will need to include details of the impact of COVID-19 on their arts practice.
